Admission Policy

Admission to the Nursing Program is contingent upon acceptance to the University and meeting the School of Nursing (SoN) requirements. The student may declare nursing as a major at any level and may seek admission to the nursing program on the Langston or Tulsa campuses after successful completion of general education requirements. Admission requirements are as follows:

1. Applicants officially admitted to Langston University
2. Completion of 60 semester hours and satisfied freshman and sophomore requirements with cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or above on a 4.0 scale.
3. ACT composite score of 15 or better.
4. A minimum of "C" is required in each of the following prerequisite courses prior to enrollment:
 - English Composition I, II and Advanced Composition
 - Math – College Algebra and Elementary Statistics
 - Chemistry
 - Sociology
 - Psychology – General & Developmental
 - Nutrition
 - Biology (for science or nursing majors) with a lab
 - Hum Anatomy
 - Human Physiology
 - Microbiology
5. No more than two (2) prerequisite courses can be repeated to earn a "C" or better. Also nursing courses can be repeated one time only (Only one readmission to the nursing program). No more than two (2) nursing courses can be repeated. Satisfactory performance on standardized achievement tests is required for progression in the nursing program.
6. Admission is competitive and based on previous academic performance. First consideration will be given to those applicants who have not had to repeat any previous academic course work.

Thank you for your interest in applying for admission to Langston University School of Nursing. This information is being provided in an effort to assist in the completion of your **application**. For fall admission to Langston and Tulsa Campuses, you will need to submit the following documentation **postmarked on or before March 1**. For spring admission to Tulsa Campus only, you must submit the documentation **postmarked on or before October 1**. Your consideration for acceptance into the nursing program will be a full-time enrollment.

You are required to complete an application for admission to Langston University prior to admission to the nursing program. The application for admission to Langston University can be found at <http://www.langston.edu/apply-now>

Along with your application submit:

1. Official transcripts from **all** universities and/or colleges attended as well as from ADN and LPN programs (including Langston University).
2. TOEFL Score if secondary education was in a school outside of the United States.
3. Typed two-page essay (12 font Times New Roman) describing:
 - a. Plan for completing prerequisite courses, if not already completed.
 - b. Your reasons for selecting nursing as a career.
 - c. Reasons for choosing the Langston University School of Nursing.
 - d. Your specific plans to insure your success in the nursing program.

After admittance to the program be aware that the following will be **required during your tenure** in the School of Nursing (SON):

1. Verify completion of all prerequisites with an official transcript(s).
2. A nationwide criminal background check through Group One. Information about obtaining a nationwide criminal background check will be given during orientation.
3. A drug screen for clinical experiences will be required through Surscan after the fall or spring semester begins.
4. Textbooks may be purchased through the Langston University Bookstore.
5. A complete current immunization record indicating freedom from tuberculosis, proof of MMR, varicella, hepatitis, and tetanus immunizations. (All clinical agencies require current immunizations.) You will **NOT** be allowed to enroll without an up to date immunization record on file. See **Permission to Enroll** information sheet.
6. Provide own transportation to clinical facilities and class.
7. Maintain a current American Heart Association CPR Basic Cardiovascular Life Support (BCLS) for the health care provider.
8. Your **Application** must be received on or before or postmarked by **March 1st** for fall admission to Langston and Tulsa campuses and **October 1st** for spring admission to Tulsa campus.
